

Fire Safety & Warden Training

This course includes both theory and practical components that will give the participants the confidence to deal with a situation where a fire is involved that requires the evacuation of all parties from the site.

Participants will, after completing this course understand the principals of fire , fire supression, roles and responsibilities of the fire warden management team, be able to identify business risks and determine how to manage and respond to those risks in the event of an incident and evacuation.

PRE-REQUISITES

ASSESSMENT

Participants will demonstrate knowledge of the elements of competency during class based training and exercises, including the use of a fire extinguisher.

Confirmation of their underpinning knowledge is also gathered through demonstrating skills during site-based exercises and drills.

CERTIFICATION

Upon successful completion of the course, participants will be issued with a CAM FIRESAFE certificate.
